Dear Parent/Carer,

Albion North Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Albion North Primary School's **voluntary** financial contributions for the 2022 school year.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Within our school this support has allowed us to improve our STEM and library resources, provide sporting equipment for classrooms and present special activities to the children such as author visits and multicultural performances.

Attached to this letter is an outline of the items we provide for your child throughout the year. The total amount for Year Six 2022 students is \$160.

Payments for 2022 are now being accepted as follows:

Payment made in October or November 25% discount = \$120 total payment

Payment made in December (before 16th December) 15% discount = \$136 total payment

Payment during the 2022 school year = \$160 total payment

Please note that to qualify for the discount a portion of the payment (greater than \$20) must be made in that month. For example a deposit of \$25 made in October will qualify for the 25% discount even if the rest of the payment is made in 2022.

## ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
