Principal Report

Pupil Free Day

A reminder that Monday 5th June is a pupil free day. This will be a report writing day for teachers and there will be no school for children. We will have **two** more pupil free days in 2017 – Monday 6th November (as advised in our first newsletter this year) and an additional day that has been approved by School Council on Thursday 21st December 2017.

Parking

In the past few weeks, I have contacted Councillor John Hedditch, Mayor of Brimbank, and members of the Victoria Police to discuss the parking and traffic issues around the school. Sadly, it appears that many of our parents do not care for their children's safety. Some of the poor driving behaviours of our parents that have been observed in Camperdown Avenue recently include:

- * Stopping on the opposite side of the road and expecting small children to cross the street alone;
- * Stopping in the middle of the road for children to get out on the wrong side and run in front of traffic;
- * Performing three-point turns in traffic on Furlong Road with children in the car;
- * Children in the front seats of cars without seat belts;
- * Children unrestrained in the back of the car, children standing up in the back of the car.

Each of these illegal activities carries a large fine and I will be asking Council to fine parents for unsafe behaviours in the coming weeks.

The pedestrian lights on Furlong Road are also a concern and I have spoken with the Mayor about this as well. Many cars do not stop at the red light, speed through the crossing when the light has turned green and drivers abuse the crossing supervisor for stopping traffic to do her job and get your children safely across the road.

Please remember that no crossing offers 100% surety that cars will stop. Make sure that you, and your children, learn to **STOP LOOK LISTEN THINK** whenever you are crossing a road regardless of whether there are traffic lights. Always double check to make sure that it is safe to cross.

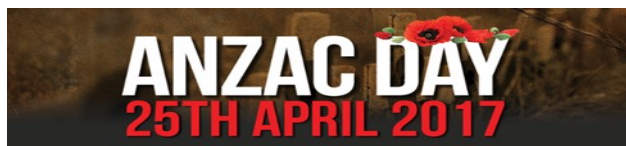
